The Special Olympics Lions Clubs International Opening Eyes® program is changing lives in communities, providing free eye assessments, prescription eyewear, sunglasses and sports goggles to people with intellectual disabilities. At the end of the 12-step visual exam, a decision is made if new glasses may be helpful. **Through the generosity of our corporate sponsors Essilor (lenses) and Safilo (frames), athletes choose from a selection of free eyewear.** Athletes who do not need any corrective lenses receive plano sunglasses provided by Safilo.

Volunteers are needed to assist with athlete in-take as well as day-of Opening Eyes screenings. All volunteers will receive training, a free t-shirt and lunch!

Purpose & Goals

- Increase access to eye care for Special Olympics athletes, as well as all people with intellectual disabilities
- Raise eye care professionals' awareness of vision and eye health concerns of people with special needs, including difficulties involved in accessing treatment
- Develop a body of knowledge about vision and eye health of children and adults with special needs
- Providing vision exams, refractions, and dispensing of appropriate eyewear to athletes
- Educating athletes, their guardians, coaches and administrators about the importance of vision to the performance of athletes in sports, school and work
